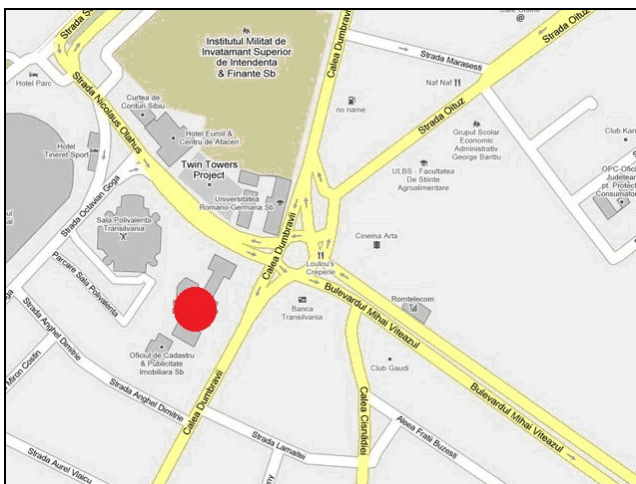

THE PROJECT

"TRANSNISTRIAN CONFLICT FILES - SOLUTIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SOCIETY ON THE TWO BANKS OF THE DNIESTER RIVER"

The Transnistrian Conflict Analysis Laboratory - the structure of the Center for Research in Political Science, International Relations and European Studies of the "Lucian Blaga" University of Sibiu, implements the project "Transnistrian Conflict Files - solutions for the development of society on the two banks of the Nistru River", carrying out activities between October 2016 and September 2017.

The aim of the project is to increase the capacity of the Romanian media to analyze and formulate solutions for the Transnistrian conflict through the professional knowledge and publicity of the causes, stages and perspectives of the development bottlenecks generated by the main themes of the Transnistrian conflict.

To this end, the LACT coordinate the systematic, documented and objective media coverage of the development problems caused by the perpetuation of the Transnistrian conflict, corroborated with policy proposals to unblock socio-economic development in the region affected by the conflict through the effort of specializing journalists from the editorial offices of the more significant Romanian national publications.

The beneficiary group consists of 5 journalists from different national coverage editorial boards, which will gather information, skills and portfolios of personal and institutional relations that are useful in the long run for the media coverage of the Transnistrian conflict files. The project will be finalized with a bilingual volume (English-Romanian) entitled "Transnistrian conflict files", including analyzes and policy proposals to unlock development on the main areas affected by the Transnistrian conflict.
